6. HEARTLAND DRIVE PAVEMENT REPAIR 2021 ~ PUBLIC HEARING

- **a)** Public hearing on the plans, specifications, estimate of cost and form of contract for the Heartland Drive Pavement Repair 2021.
- **b)** Consider **resolution** approving the plans, specifications, estimate of cost and form of contract; ordering bids, setting a date for the receiving of bids; and directing posting of the bid letting; all for the Heartland Drive Pavement Repair 2021.

<u>Note</u>: This is for a 3 Inch HMA overlay and full-depth PCC pavement removal and replacement from Heartland Drive.

7. PART OF LOT 7, FOLSOM'S SUBDIVISION

a) ORDINANCE NO. 2021-1010 An ordinance amending the Coralville Community Plan to reflect certain property generally known as Part of Lot 7, Folsom's Subdivision, Coralville, lowa to be designated Mixed Use in place of Corridor Commercial Use, for 2nd consideration.

<u>Note</u>: This will change the land use map for a property located in the SW Quadrant of 2nd Street & 1st Avenue from Corridor Commercial to Mixed Use.

8. CONSTRUCTION SERVICES AGREEMENT

 Consider resolution approving a Construction Services Agreement with Wagner Construction Services.

Note: This agreement is to build out the Celio space in the Iowa River Landing and is not to exceed \$41,920.00.

9. JAMES STREET RAILROAD CROSSING

a) Consider **resolution** approving a Proposal with Shoemaker-Haaland Professional Engineers for the James Street Railroad Crossing Study.

Note: This is to study the feasibility of constructing a new railroad crossing on James Street at the south leg of existing Highway 6 and Lowes signalized intersection. This agreement is not to exceed \$19,500.00.

10. CRANDIC FLOOD PROTECTION PROJECT MUSSEL MONITORING

a) Consider **resolution** approving a Consulting Services Agreement with EcoAnalysts, Inc. for the final mussel monitoring report required for the CRANDIC Flood Protection Project.

<u>Note</u>: This is agreement provides for the final mussel monitoring event and report to satisfy the City's US Army Corps of Engineers Permit requirement for this flood protection project and is not to exceed \$27,708.50.

11. BONDS

a) Consider resolution fixing a date of meeting at which it is proposed to take action for entering into one or more amendments to a Lease Purchase Agreement thereto in connection with the Brown Deer Golf Course.

<u>Note</u>: This is to refinance the 2016B1 and 2016 B2 COPS for the Brown Deer Golf Course in order to pursue interest rate savings.

b) Consider resolution making a determination to issue Annual Appropriation Tax Increment Revenue Refunding Bonds, setting parameters for the sale, approving Purchase Agreements, Official Statements and other related documents, and authorizing the call of outstanding bonds.

<u>Note</u>: This is to refinance the 2011F COPs issue for the Coralville Center for the Performing Arts in order to pursue interest rate savings.

12. OPTION AGREEMENTS

 Consider resolution approving an Option Agreement with IRL Parkview Investments, LLC.

<u>Note</u>: This option is for IRL Parkview Investments, LLC to purchase property for their development from the City for the sum of \$12.50 per square foot pursuant to a prior purchase agreement. This is necessary to qualify for a Workforce Housing Tax Credit.

b) Consider **resolution** approving an Option Agreement with 6 & 6th Developers, LLC.

<u>Note</u>: This option is for 6 & 6th Developers to purchase the "driveway" that comes from Highway 6 to the back of the 808 on 5th property for their development on the northwest corner of 6th Avenue and Highway 6. This is necessary to qualify for a Workforce Housing Tax Credit.

13. WORKFORCE HOUSING TAX CREDITS

a) Consider **resolution** of support of the Application of Coralville Housing Group II, LLC for funding via the Workforce Housing Tax Credit Program and pledging City monies for the same.

<u>Note</u>: This grant is for the Coral North Apartments at 2500 Holiday Court with the City pledging in-kind support of \$1,000.00 per residential unit for 49 units.

b) Consider **resolution** of support of the Application of BBCO, LLC for funding via the Workforce Housing Tax Credit Program and pledging City monies for the same.

Note: This grant is for the Town Center One on 10th Avenue just north of West Bank with the City pledging in-kind support of \$1,000.00 per residential unit for 80 units.

<u>Note</u>: This grant is for the IRL Parkview II in the lowa River Landing with the City pledging in-kind support of \$1,000.00 per residential unit for 68 units.

d) Consider **resolution** of support of the Application of 6 & 6th Developers, LLC for funding via the Workforce Housing Tax Credit Program and pledging City monies for the same.

<u>Note</u>: This grant is for the 6 & 6th Phase I on northwest corner of 6th Avenue and Highway 6 with the City pledging in-kind support of \$1,000.00 per residential unit for 100 units.

e) Consider **resolution** of support of the Application of Rael Development Corporation/RDC Fund XIII Investments, LLC for funding via the Workforce Housing Tax Credit Program and pledging City monies for the same.

Note: This grant is for the housing project located south of U.S. Highway 6; west of 1st Avenue and east of Clear Creek in Coralville with the City pledging in-kind support of \$1,000.00 per residential unit for 300 units.
